As you know, I always welcome feedback from readers, and suggestions for newsletter content. This month I'm featuring a product which has been recommended to me by Sandra, who was an Organised Chaos client, back in 2008!

I'm thrilled that Sandra has completely embraced the Organised Chaos ethos regarding storage and de-cluttering. She contacted me recently to tell me about a shoe storage system she's purchased, and kindly invited me to visit her to take a look. An offer I couldn't refuse! (see photo below)



I was extremely impressed with what I saw, and have no hesitation in recommending this system to you.

So many of my clients have untidy heaps of shoes cluttering their kitchen or hallway. This is not only unsightly, but it can be hard to locate pairs of shoes from within the pile!

Maybe your house is like this? If your family has no designated place to put their shoes when they take them off, chances are they just get tossed into a corner. You may have felt this is a helpless situation.

Wouldn't it be great to know exactly where your shoes were when you needed them? Even if your shoes are in the bottom of your wardrobe they may still be in a muddle.

The beauty of this system is that it enables shoes to be stacked anywhere. It is completely flexible regarding layout; being assembled from plastic parts which are easy to put together. No tools or DIY skills needed!

The clever design makes the most of your vertical space - so the shoes are out of your way, but still easily accessible, and of course, they're really tidy!



The design of the Flexi Rack is very simple and consists of three types of plastic part: side panels, back panels and shelf panels. From these three components it is possible for you to construct a shoe storage system to fit any space, even those awkward corners that aren't normally used!

The Flexi Rack website even has an online tool to help you design your own bespoke shoe storage system. How cool is that?



Because the system is modular, it's possible to buy extra pieces to expand your shoe rack if you gain extra pairs of shoes. So if your situation changes in any way, you won't need to buy a complete new set of racking.

Also handy for storing all sorts of other items such as handbags for instance (providing they're not too heavy).

The photo on the left shows Sandra's system, taken from the side view.

The lady who designed the Flexi Rack, tells me she is a very organised person and just got fed up with having piles of shoes all around the house. Luckily for us, she has translated her idea into a useful and practical product.

The photo opposite, shows what can be done if you purchase the "24 shelf pack". Note how the different heights of boots and shoes are easily accommodated. This means you make the best use of your available space.

Everyone is catered for, "packs" are offered from 8 shelves to 50 shelves, so you get exactly the system you need.



You will notice that the above photo shows the rack in purple. Sandra purchased the white version. Other options are red and black. So plenty of scope for his and hers shoe racks!
